Texas ranks 45th in the country for per-student funding. It's no wonder our teachers are struggling with overwhelming workloads and low pay—fueling a teacher retention crisis—and that other school employees like paraprofessionals and cafeteria workers are making poverty wages.

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- Texas AFT represents all nonadministrative certified and classified public school employees in traditional public schools and some charter schools.
- We represent the interests of teachers, counselors, librarians, diagnosticians, custodians, cafeteria workers, bus drivers, nurses, teaching assistants, and clerical employees.
- We also represent employees in universities, colleges, and community and junior colleges.

Save on Your Student Loans


Texas AFT hosts student debt clinics throughout the year that help educators save thousands of dollars using federal programs.

You're Not "A Loan"

Here's what you need to know about Public Service Loan Forgiveness — and how our union helps you get the relief you deserve.

In 2021, following the settlement of a lawsuit brought by American Federation of Teachers (AFT) members, the U.S. Department of Education announced major changes to the Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF) program.

Because AFT members took action to fight against a system riddled with unfair practices and broken promises, hundreds of thousands of educators, healthcare professionals, and public employees can now discharge their student debt sooner.

Qualifying for Loan Forgiveness

- If you've worked in public service for 10 years or more and made 10 years of payments on your student loans, you're likely eligible to have your debt discharged under PSLF.
- Even if you were denied PSLF in the past or your loan service said you didn't qualify, your application will be reconsidered after this AFT lawsuit settlement.
- Now, the Department of Education will count your past payments retroactively toward the PSLF 120-payment requirement — even if they were made on the "wrong" loan type or "wrong" payment plan.
- You must take advantage of these changes by Oct. 31, 2022, to have your past payments counted.
