



PAY RAISES FOR TEACHERS AND ALL PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES

With less than 40 days remaining in the Texas legislative session, pay raises for public school employees needs more support. **TAKE ACTION!**

HB 100 - It's Moving

HB 100 by Rep. Ken King has passed out of the House Public Education Committee. This bill provides no raises for support staff. It provides just a \$90 increase per student to the basic allotment, when we need more than \$1,000 per student just to keep pace with inflation.

SB 9 - It's Moving

The Senate has passed its own flawed "teacher raise" bill, though it hasn't gotten momentum in the House. SB 9 also provides nothing for support staff, and it creates a two-tier system of raises for teachers. Teachers in large districts would get a \$2,000 raise. Teachers in smaller districts would get a \$6,000 raise. The Senate claims this is to make pay more equitable for rural teachers, but the result is that a small wealthy district would be able to offer teachers a larger raise than its next-door neighbor.

HB 1548 - Needs Action!

HB 1548 by Rep. James Talarico, which would provide a \$15,000 raise for teachers and certified staff and a 25% raise for support staff, has been referred to the House Public Education Committee but has not received a hearing. Nor was that funding guaranteed in the proposed House budget.

HB 4586 - Needs Action!

HB 4586 by Rep. Gina Hinojosa, which would provide a \$10,000 raise for teachers and certified staff and a 15% raise for support staff, has been referred to the House Public Education Committee but has not received a hearing. Nor was that funding guaranteed in the proposed House budget.
